## STAND UP AND BE COUNTED

According to the 2005 Special City Census, the City of Spring Hill has a population of 17,325 residents. However, based on housing permits and utility hookups which have occurred since the completion of the most recent Census, we believe that we have many more residents that have not been counted. By the city's estimates there are **over 24,000 people in our city**. That's why we need your help.

We need you to complete the census form in your mailbox. It's short, simple and very important. It's important to you because of the revenue that Spring Hill receives from the state in the form of shared tax revenues. These additional revenues allow us to maintain a low property tax rate and to provide much needed services such as police, fire protection, and expand our parks. However, these revenues are based upon a certified population base.

**In order to provide for the needs of our growing families, such as schools, parks, library programs we also need to collect information about the age range of our population.**

**Please take a moment to do the following:**

- 1. List your complete street address including any apartment number. (Even if you receive your mail at a post office box);**
- 2. List the first and last name and current age of all persons living at this address.**
- 3. Detach this form at the perforations and return it in the postage paid envelope.**

In order to verify the accuracy of the census, we are required to either receive a response from each resident or to personally visit the residents who do not respond.
