Arrangements Set for Spring Hill Corporal Who Died after Friday Crash *Fallen Officer Receiving Full Honors at Visitation and Funeral Services*



Spring Hill, TN – The body of fallen Spring Hill Police Corporal Jeremy McLaren arrived a short time ago at the Williamson Memorial Funeral Home in Franklin. Police officers have remained with him, around the clock, since his death Sunday afternoon. “*Having an officer remain with Corporal McLaren is simply the right thing to do,*” said Spring Hill Police Chief John Smith. “*We never leave one of our own. A police officer will continually be with him until he is laid to rest, out of respect for him, his family, and everyone who loved him.*”

Corporal McLaren joined the Department on June 25, 2007. He died at 12:16 Sunday afternoon at the Vanderbilt University Medical Center after experiencing complications following surgery Friday night to stabilize a leg injury he suffered during a two-car collision. Corporal McLaren was 28-years-old.

Visitation for Corporal McLaren will take place at the Williamson Memorial Funeral Home, 3009 Columbia Avenue in Franklin on Wednesday, 02/10/2010 from 5:00 pm – 9:00 pm, and again on Thursday, 02/11/2010, from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm and 5:00 pm – 9:00 pm. Corporal McLaren’s funeral service will be held at Brentwood Baptist Church, 7777 Concord Road, on Friday, 02/12/2010 at 11:00 am. Following the service, the procession will travel to Spring Hill where Corporal McLaren’s body will be driven past the Spring Hill Police Department for one final time. The procession will then continue to the Spring Hill Cemetery, 5110 Gallatin Pike, in Nashville.
