

A RESOLUTION RELATIVE
TO REQUESTING A PRIVATE ACT OF THE
GENERAL ASSEMBLY MODIFYING THE CHARTER FOR
THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL

WHEREAS, by Private Acts 1991, ch. 154, the Tennessee General Assembly by private act adopted the Charter for the Town of Spring Hill (hereinafter referred to as the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, by action of the General Assembly through the 1997 legislative session, the Charter has been modified, amended and revised from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen is authorized from time to time to request from the General Assembly a private act modifying, amending and revising the Charter;

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen hereby requests of State Senator Keith Jordan and State Representative Bobby W. Sands the introduction of bill to enact a private act amending the Charter as follows:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to request of State Senator Keith Jordan and State Representative Bobby W. Sands the introduction of bill to enact a private act amending the Charter as follow:

Article I Section 1-105 of the Charter is deleted in its entirety and the following

substituted therefor:


1-105. Terms of mayor and aldermen. Aldermen shall serve staggered four year terms.

Municipal elections shall be conducted every two years at which time four aldermen, on from each ward, shall be elected for four year terms.

The term of the mayor of the Town of Spring Hill returns to two years. The next regular election for mayor shall occur in the year 1999, at which time a mayor will be elected for a two year term expiring in the year 2001. In 1999 and thereafter a mayor will be elected every two years.

The terms of mayor and aldermen shall commence and terminate on the third Monday of April following the elections commencing in 1995.


