Also present: Patrick Carter, City Attorney; April Goad, City Recorder; Tonya Travis, Finance Director.


1. Consider Resolution 21-57, to approve a Use Agreement with the Columbia Bicycle Club, Inc. d/b/a The Columbia Cycling Club.
