**1. Consider Second and Final Reading of Ordinance 20-10, to approve Appropriation Ordinance for the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021.**

Mayor Graham made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice Mayor Wurth.  
Alderman Allen made a motion to increase State Street Aid (121-43190-254) from \$86,900 to \$91,000 for design services for the Buckner Road transition. Mayor Graham seconded.

Motion carried, 8/0.

Mayor called for the vote on second reading of Ordinance 20-10 as amended.

**Concerned Citizens**


Mr. Downham provided information on storage request by Williamson County Emergency Agency/TN Emergency Mgt. to temporarily store 20 tractor trailer loads of supplies such as gowns, masks, gloves etc. All used by first responders and such. This would be anywhere from 30-90 days. He and Patrick have been talking with Cresendo on the timing that would work.  
He recommends they provide the storage at no charge.  
Alderman Fitterer agrees with the recommendation of up to 90 days, just suggests a letter that the city is held harmless.
