**Item #1 – Update and Discussion on Williamson County Sports Authority Meeting and P3 Partnership Jeff Graves**

**Item #4 – Review of rough draft statement to BOMA and Battle Creek Property Jeff Graves**


The task force is still of the opinion that two different facilities may still be the best option for Spring Hill. One location dedicated to the pent-up demand for facilities to support local sports teams. The Battle Creek Property could easily meet this need with a significant number of acres usable for field sports that do not required fixed structures A second location could be secured to develop a Sports Plex designed to be a Southeastern regional facility. This kind of facility would draw large sporting tournaments to Spring Hill and could bring a significant economic impact to the city.

**Item #5 – Round table discussion**


It is important that we provide information to decision makers concerning the use of lands that are in flood plains. These acres can be utilized for field sports that do not require fixed structures. Access to land with several times of specification can provide for cost effective use of funding and more robust facilities.
