

ORDINANCE 13-16

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE FIFTEEN (15), SECTION 608 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Alderman by passage of this Ordinance, hereby amends the Spring Hill Municipal Code to more specifically address parking on public streets in residentially zoned property, and shall state as follows:


15-608. Parking of Commercial Vehicles and Motorhomes on Public Streets in Residential Zones Restricted.

- a. No person shall park any motor vehicle licensed and/or primarily used for commercial purposes ***for more than ten (10) hours per day*** on any public street in residentially zoned districts. This restriction includes school busses or trailers attached or attachable to any commercial vehicle. ***By virtue of this section there shall be no overnight parking of any motor vehicle licenses and/or primarily used for commercial purposes on public streets within residentially zoned districts unless specifically authorized by the City Recorder pursuant to Subsection (d) below.***
- b. No motor homes, trailers, boats with trailers, campers, fifth wheel or other recreational vehicles shall be permitted to be parked on any public street, ***for more than ten (10) hours per day in residentially zoned districts. By virtue of this section there shall be no overnight parking of any of the vehicles listed within this section on public streets within residentially owned districts unless specifically authorized by the City Recorder pursuant to Subsection (d) below.***
- c. Excluded from this section entirely are emergency service vehicles.
- d. ***Each household (defined as a person or group of people occupying a single dwelling) within the City of Spring Hill may request a permit from the City Recorder for overnight parking on public streets for vehicles referenced in Subsection (a) and (b) herein. Valid permits issued by the City Recorder shall allow continuous on street parking for a period of forty-eight (48) hours from the time and date the permit is issued. Each household, as defined herein, shall be entitle to five (5) permits per calendar year.***

NOW THEREFORE IT BE FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Spring Hill City Code be amended by this Ordinance to further restrict and limit parking in residentially zoned property; and

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that all Ordinances in conflict herewith be, and the same hereby repealed.


