

ORDINANCE 13-29

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 13-12 (TITLE NINE (9) CHAPTER THREE (3) OF THE SPRING HILL MUNICIPAL CODE), CORRECTING A TYPOGRAPHICAL ERROR

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill adopted Ordinance 13-12 on May 20, 2013 in order to regulate the practice of panhandling while balancing First Amendment rights of individuals in needs with the safety, health and welfare of the residents and visitors within the city limits of Spring Hill, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the addition to Ordinance 13-12, paragraph 2 currently refers to:

“9-205 AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING PROHIBITED.”

WHEREAS, the section should be corrected to refer to:

“9-305 AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING PROHIBITED.”

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE:


That the City Code, Title Nine (9), be amended with the correction of Section 9-305 as written above.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this ordinance shall take effect from and after its adoption, the public welfare requiring it.


Passed and adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee on the 18th day of November, 2013.

ORDINANCE 13-12

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE NINE (9) CHAPTER THREE (3) OF THE SPRING HILL MUNICIPAL CODE, ADDING SECTION 9-305 REGARDING PANHANDLING IN THE CITY OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill desires to regulate the practice of panhandling while balancing First Amendment rights of individuals in needs with the safety, health and welfare of the residents and visitors within the city limits of Spring Hill, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Title Nine (9), Chapter Three (3), Charitable Solicitors shall be amended by adding an additional section, 9-305 address, the activity of panhandling, and shall be written be us follows:

9-205 AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING PROHIBITED

Aggressive panhandling prohibited.

(1) As used in this section, "panhandling" means any vocal solicitation, bodily gestures or written signs made in person upon any street, public place or park in the city, in which a person requests an immediate donation of money or other property from another person.

(2) It shall be unlawful to engage in an act of panhandling on any day between ½ hour before sunset and ½ hour before sunrise.

(3) It shall be unlawful to engage in an act of panhandling when either the panhandler or the person being solicited is located at any of the following locations:

- (a) At a bus stop;
- (b) In a public transportation vehicle or public transportation facility;
- (c) In a vehicle which is parked or stopped on a public street or alley;
- (d) In a sidewalk café
- (e) Within one hundred feet (100') in any direction from an automatic teller machine or entrance to a bank; or
- (f) Any panhandling, or other solicitation, which may impede the normal flow of traffic.

(4) It shall be unlawful to engage in an act of panhandling in an aggressive manner, including any of the following:

- (a) Touching the solicited person without the solicited person's consent;
