

ORDINANCE NO. 98-32

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR/VICE MAYOR OF SPRING HILL
TO GRANT THE POWER OF THE MAYORAL VOTE
TO THE VICE MAYOR OR OTHER ELECTED OFFICIAL
AS A PROXY VOTE WHICH THEY MAY USE IN ALL MEETINGS
WITH OTHER AGENCIES, COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS OR OTHER GROUPS
WHEREIN THE MAYOR MAY POSSESS A RIGHT
TO A VOTE AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF SPRING HILL

Whereas, the duties of the Mayor of Spring Hill include the right and obligation to meet with other agencies, committees, commissions or other groups as may be formed for joint discussions about common interests among many agencies, and


Whereas, the mayoral position in Spring Hill is a part time position and in probability will be held by a person still gainfully employed at other work thereby creating an attendance difficulty and hardship upon the Mayor, and

Whereas, other persons may, at the discretion of the Mayor, assume these meeting and voting obligations on behalf of the Town

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE that the Mayor is empowered to grant the Mayoral voting privilege, as a proxy vote, to the Vice Mayor or other elected official as designated by the Mayor or Vice Mayor while such officials are in attendance at any meetings with other agencies, committees, commissions or other groups, any of which are not exclusively a Spring Hill group, and


Be it further ordained that the Mayor is authorized to exercise this right to grant a proxy vote entirely at the discretion of the Mayor and under conditions of instruction and direction as may be given by the Mayor.
