

**AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE TERM OF OFFICE
OF THE MAYOR OF SPRING HILL
FROM A FOUR YEAR TERM TO A TWO YEAR TERM
BY CHANGING THE THIRD PARAGRAPH
OF SECTION 1-105, CHAPTER ONE, TITLE ONE,
TO INCORPORATE THE MAYORAL TWO YEAR TERM OF OFFICE**

Whereas, Spring Hill is determined to be the fastest growing town in Tennessee causing events and changes in government to happen at a more rapid pace than is typical, and

Whereas, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen have assessed the term of office of the Mayor and have concluded that the voting citizens, in contemplation of the rapid change in the size of the town with the corresponding need of city government to keep pace, should have a right to a more expeditious judgement upon the performance of the Mayor, and

Whereas, the General Assembly of Tennessee, in their 1998 session, and upon request of the governing Board of Spring Hill, did adopt legislation (Senate Bill 436/House Bill 3448) to amend Tennessee Code Annotated Title 6, Chapter 3, Section 6-3-102, to allow Spring Hill to change the term of office of the Mayor from four years to two years

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE that Section 1-105 of the 1995 Municipal Code will be changed as follows:

"1-105. Terms of mayor and aldermen.

At the regular election for the year 1999, four aldermen, one from each ward, shall be elected for four year terms. The mayor shall be elected for two year terms commencing with the regular election in 1999. Thereafter, municipal elections shall be conducted every two years at which time four aldermen, one from each ward, shall be elected for a four year term and the Mayor shall be elected to a two year term.

Nothing in this section shall affect the present term of the board of mayor and aldermen.


The terms of mayor and aldermen shall commence and terminate on the third Monday of April following the elections commencing in 1999."
