TO FRANKFIELDS, INC.**


BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE

amount of \$179,450.00.


The Mayor is authorized to sign the contract for

engineers.






## TOWN OF SPRING HILL

There has been exhibited to her a copy of an Initial Bond Resolution which was passed and adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill on March 18, 1991, together with a copy of a notice which appeared in The Daily Herald, a newspaper of general circulation in Maury County, Tennessee, on March 28, 1991, and also in the Spring Hill Morning Sun, which was a newspaper of general circulation within the Town of Spring Hill, in which the resolution was set forth in full, and which contained, in part, the following:
