


A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE MAURY COUNTY
ELECTION COMMISSION TO CONDUCT AN
ELECTION WITHIN THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF THE
TOWN OF SPRING HILL ON MAY 8, 1993,
TO ELECT A MAYOR AND ONE ALDERMEN
FROM EACH OF THE FOUR WARDS PURSUANT
TO THE ELECTION LAWS OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE
TOWN OF SPRING HILL:

THAT the Maury County Election Commission be authorized
and requested to conduct the regular annual municipal election for
the Town of Spring Hill on Saturday, May 8, 1993, for the purpose
of electing a Mayor, and one Aldermen from each of the four wards,
each for a term of two years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor is hereby
authorized to request the Maury County Election Commission to hold
its election, the cost of which will, by law, be borne by the Town
of Spring Hill.

RESOLUTION NO. 92-3

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill:

WHEREAS, the Town of Spring Hill is eligible for funds for sanitary sewer line rehabilitation under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; and


WHEREAS, there exists a need to rehabilitate the sanitary sewer system of the Town of Spring Hill; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill wishes to make an application for this project.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved:

- (1) The Mayor is authorized and directed to execute and submit an application for funds to the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development in the amount of \$304,000.00, of the total costs of the project which is estimated to be \$360,000.00;
- (2) The Mayor is authorized and directed to enter into any and all necessary agreements to receive and administer any funds received as a result of this application; and
- (3) The Town of Spring Hill is eligible for 84% of the estimated cost of the project to be paid solely from funds that might be received from the grant. The balance of \$54,000.00, or 16%, is to be provided by the Town of Spring Hill from its sewer reserve fund, if the expenditures from this fund are eligible for the project, otherwise from other funds of the Town of Spring Hill.


