

**RESOLUTION 99-38**


**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A BILL IN THE  
TENNESSEE STATE LEGISLATURE TO CHANGE THE NAME "TOWN  
OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE" TO THE "CITY OF SPRING HILL,  
TENNESSEE"**

**WHEREAS**, the designation of Spring Hill as a Town is no longer appropriate for a growing City; and

**WHEREAS**, there exists a need to have legal documents accurately reflect the correct name throughout instead of being alternately called "Town" or "City".

**NOW, THEREFORE** Be It Resolved by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee, that the City Attorney is authorized to prepare and file any and all documents necessary to change the official designation of "Town" to "City".

**A RESOLUTION RELATIVE**  
**TO REQUESTING A PRIVATE ACT OF THE**  
**GENERAL ASSEMBLY MODIFYING THE CHARTER FOR**  
**THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL**

WHEREAS, by private Acts 1991, ch. 154, the Tennessee General Assembly by private act adopted the Charter for the Town of Spring Hill (herein referred to as the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, by action of the General Assembly through 1999 legislative session, the Charter has been modified, amended and revised from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen is authorized from time to time to request from the General Assembly a private act modifying, amending and revising the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen hereby requests of State Senator Marsha Blackburn and State Representatives Bobby Sands and Mike Williams the introduction of bill to enact a private act amending the Charter as follows:


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to request of State Senator Marshal Blackburn and State Representative Bobby Sands and Mike Williams the introduction of bill to enact a private act amending the Charter as follows:

Section 6-1-204 (a) of the Charter is deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

(a) All persons qualified to vote in Maury or Williamson County for members of the General Assembly, as prescribed by the general law, shall be qualified to vote in any election held in accordance with the provisions of this Act, provided, however, that no person shall be qualified to vote in any such election who shall not have been a bona fide resident of the City for at least six months immediately preceding the

date of such election, but provided, further, that any resident citizen and qualified voter of Maury or Williamson County, who has been a bona fide owner of property real or personal located within the corporate limits of said City and shown on the tax rolls of the City for more than twelve (12) months prior to the date of any elections, may register and vote in said City in any election held under the provisions of this Charter except in the elections for the issuance of bonds.
