

RESOLUTION No. 98-18

**A RESOLUTION TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT
WITH LAWRENCEBURG COMMUNICATIONS, LAWRENCEBURG, TENNESSEE,
FOR SERVICES TO INCLUDE AN ANTENNA EXTENSION,
A 100 WATT REPEATER AND REPROGRAMMING
OF RADIOS IN ORDER FOR THE TOWN TO ENTER
INTO A DISPATCH SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH MAURY COUNTY
FOR THE SUM OF \$14,076, WITH FUNDS
TO BE DRAWN FROM IMPACT FEES**

Whereas, the governing Board has determined that the agreement for dispatch services should be changed from the Maury County Sheriff's department to Maury County Comm (also named ECom and/or 911), and

Whereas, an agreement is now being prepared to change the dispatch service to the new agency as of July 1, 1998, when the existing contract is concluded, and

Whereas, it is therefore necessary to install 40 foot of additional height to the antenna at city hall, install a 100 watt repeater and reprogram radios, do all necessary peripheral work for these primary bid items, and

Whereas, this specified work was properly advertised, bids were taken, and staff has recommended that Lawrenceburg Communications is the lowest and best bidder

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN of the Town of Spring Hill that the Mayor and City Recorder are authorized, empowered and directed to enter into an agreement with Lawrenceburg Communications, for the sum of \$14,076, to do work as specified in the public advertisement to include the antenna extension, install a 100 watt repeater, reprogram all two way radios, funds are to be drawn from the police department FY 1998 budget accounts.

A CONSOLIDATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL
AND
MAURY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT

This agreement is made by and between the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee, 37174, a Municipality located at 199 Town Center Parkway, Spring Hill (Maury County) Tennessee and Maury Emergency Communications District located at 1010 Galloway Street, Columbia (Maury County) Tennessee, 38401

WHEREAS, the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee and Maury Emergency Communications District desire to create a working arrangement/contract under the terms and conditions of this agreement:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the following covenants and promises, the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee, and Maury Emergency Communications District agree as follows:

The Maury Emergency Communications District agrees to enter into a contract which is acceptable to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Maury E-911 and the Spring Hill Police and Fire Departments as it relates to the NCIC/TCIC/TIES operations, equipment, and rules and regulations.

The Maury Emergency Communications District agrees to pay all expenses as they relate to E-911 radio upgrade, supplemental salaries for E-911 telecommunicators, E-911 building renovation/expansion, telephone system upgrade and wiring expenses at the E-911 office necessary at the time of entering this agreement. If any additional changes later become necessary to the system upgrades or any other items specified above, negotiations will occur at that time between said parties.

The Town of Spring Hill agrees to be responsible for the relocation and necessary maintenance, replacement, and upgrading of police radio equipment, NCIC/TCIC/TIES computer equipment, and/or any other equipment currently owned by the Spring Hill police department and used primarily for police department operations. This responsibility will continue on an annual basis. The town of Spring Hill will furnish a computer to the District for their use in running NCIC/TCIC/TIES. The District will monitor alarms that the Spring Hill police department is currently monitoring on both the Maury and Williamson sides.

The Town of Spring Hill agrees to pay the Maury Emergency Communications District the TOTAL SUM of \$2,666.67 per MONTH for operational costs for this consolidation. After one year this amount shall be evaluated.

The contract shall be negotiable, with regard to providing sufficient monies for this communications service. It shall also include a twenty five percent benefits package and be adjusted annually for cost of living increases and shall be evaluated annually.

The Maury Emergency Communications District further agrees to continue to provide dispatching for the Town of Spring Hill fire department at no additional cost to the Town of Spring Hill.

The Town of Spring Hill and Maury Emergency Communications (911) District agree to an annual evaluation/review of the consolidated dispatch operation to insure that the intent of this agreement is being complied with by both parties and to improve the overall operation of this consolidation. This evaluation/review would also include any unforeseen problems which develop and are not covered in the original agreement. The evaluation/review will be conducted by the E-911 Director, an employee of the E-911 District, Spring Hill City Administrator, a representative of the Spring Hill police department and representative of the Spring Hill fire department.

This agreement shall become effective on the date of its signing, with the first monthly payment due the Maury Emergency Communications District thirty days from the first day the Town of Spring Hill is operational at the E-911 location.

It is the intent of this document and the promises and agreements it contains that they shall be binding on the successors, representatives, and assigns of the Town of Spring Hill, Spring Hill police department, Spring Hill fire department and Maury Emergency Communications District, the safety and welfare of the citizens of Spring Hill requiring it.

This agreement approved and signed on the 1st day of July 1998.
