

RESOLUTION NO. 96-9

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COMMENCEMENT
BY THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL OF A WATER WORKS
CAPITAL PROJECT TO BE KNOWN
AS THE DENNING ROAD WATER LINE PROJECT**

Whereas, the Town of Spring Hill is being provided water through an 8-inch water line which runs along U. S. Highway 31 to the Town Hall water tank;

Whereas, this line is rapidly becoming inadequate to provide the summer seasonal needs of a Town rapidly approaching 4,000 population resulting from continuing development and as estimated by the Town's staff based on the recent census count and building permit applications;

Whereas, the Town staff and the Town consulting engineer have determined that the most logical plan to meet this need is an additional water supply line along a cross country route from the Saturn-Haynes Haven site on U. S. Highway 31 down the property lines of several property owners to a juncture with Kedron Road near Royal Park Boulevard; and

Whereas, the easement description, survey, and design contract documents need to be prepared immediately by the Town's consulting engineer in order for construction work to be done as soon as possible before hot weather.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE that:

A waterworks capital project to be known as the Denning Road Water Line Project is hereby adopted.

The firm of Highers and Koonce, with Gene "Buddy" Koonce acting as consulting engineer of record, will commence work on the Project immediately on easement descriptions, survey, and contract documents, and will be paid in increments customary to the engineering profession and to the Farmers Home Administration, also known as the Rural Economic Development Agency, guidelines for a total fee of six and one-half percent (6.5%) of the total monies paid to the construction contractor for construction work done through a turnkey completion of the Project. The consulting engineer will be responsible for work inspection through turnkey completion of the Project.

Monies for survey, design, and Project inspection will be appropriated from certificates of deposit now reaching maturity in various banks, these particular certificates of deposit having been drawn entirely from fees collected for water taps and sewer taps sold for new development.
