

RESOLUTION NO. 96-54

**A RESOLUTION TO PARTICIPATE
IN A MAURY COUNTY WIDE GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM
IN THE SUM OF \$6,000
TO BE DRAWN FROM IMPACT FEES FOR ALL WARDS**

Whereas, the State of Tennessee has opted to use Maury County as a demonstration base for a county wide geographic information system (GIS) and the State has funded all aerial photography for same on the condition that the agencies in Maury County participate on a sharing basis;

Whereas, Maury County government, City of Columbia and City of Mount Pleasant have all previously signed on for sharing according to a per capita formula;

Whereas, Spring Hill is not staffed to produce mapping and other graphic information as continuously sought and needed by the public;


Whereas, a GIS system has hundreds of computer graphic "overlays" which may be added to the system on a schedule as determined by the Town, and such possibility offers the Town the best and most economical means to achieve graphic information in the future;

Whereas, all citizens benefit more or less equally by Town participation in a GIS project, therefore all four wards should contribute from impact fees collected for the general purpose of infrastructure improvements.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE that the following action be adopted:

The Board of Mayor and Alderman is opting to participate in a Maury County wide geographic information system (GIS) and to offer initial funding to Maury County in the sum of \$6,000. These funds are to be drawn from the aggregate impact funds of all four wards.
