

RESOLUTION NO. 97-40

A RESOLUTION TO PURCHASE TWO POLICE CRUISERS  
FOR A SUM NOT TO EXCEED \$12,500  
WITH FUNDS TO BE DRAWN FROM THE POLICE EQUIPMENT FUND,  
WITH FUNDS TO BE TRANSFERRED  
TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES IN THE FY 1998 BUDGET

Whereas, the Town has created two new police officer positions in the police department and has recently hired two new police officers to fill those positions and additional cruisers are needed to maintain fleet strength;

Whereas, at direction of the governing Board, bid requests were publicly advertised in the Franklin Review Appeal on August 6, 1997, and the Columbia Daily Herald on August 5, 1997, and bids were received and opened at the regular work session of the Board on August 11, 1997;

Whereas, Blue Streak Motors, Ashland, KY, was determined to be the low (and only) responsive bidder; and

Whereas, these cruisers are sold with an extended performance warranty and have been checked for quality by staff in the police department and are deemed to serve the departmental needs at a fair price;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE, that the governing Board will authorize the police chief to purchase two cruisers for a sum not to exceed \$12,500 with funds to be drawn from the police equipment fund, such funds will be transferred to police department capital expenditures in the FY 1998 budget inasmuch as the purchase of cruisers are a capital expenditure
