

RESOLUTION NO. 97-42

A RESOLUTION TO DO PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE ON  
STREETS IN BUCKNER PLACE SUBDIVISION  
BY THE METHODOLOGY OF REJUVENATION  
FOR THE SUM OF \$0.45 PER SQUARE YARD WITH  
FUNDS TO BE DRAWN FROM CAPITOL OUTLAY FUNDS  
IN THE STREETS BUDGET

Whereas, a number of streets in Spring Hill are approaching a ten year life on the initial (original) hot mix paving construction; and


Whereas, the governing Board has decided that a philosophy of preventive maintenance, rather than "breakdown" or reconstruction maintenance, is preferable for all city owned property;

Whereas, numerical calculation proves that preventive maintenance on streets is more economical on a per annum/ per mile cost basis than maintenance by repeat cycles of hot mix asphalt topping;

Whereas, there exists a proven method of bringing flexibility, as well as small crack closure, back to the surface of hot mix asphalt streets in order to counteract the drying and brittleness also known as "oxidation" of advancing street surface age;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE, that the Mayor and City Recorder are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute and enter into a contract with Pavement Technology, Inc., Westlake, Ohio, for rejuvenation per specifications as used by the City of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, for the approximate 12,300 S.Y. of streets in Buckner Place subdivision for the unit price of \$0.45 per S.Y. with funds to be drawn from capitol outlay monies in the streets budget
