

RESOLUTION 11-84

A Resolution to Commend Lifeguard Marissa LePore

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill would like to recognize the heroic and life saving measures taken by Marissa LePore on 25 July 2011.

WHEREAS, Miss LePore is a lifeguard for Longview Recreational Center in Spring Hill Tennessee.

WHEREAS, at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, July 25, lifeguards spotted a 3 year old girl floating on her back in the shallow end of the outdoor pool, next to a children's play feature. When scanning back across the pool, lifeguards saw her face down in the water. Immediately Miss LePore acted swiftly in pulling the unconscious young girl from the water and began immediately performing CPR.

WHEREAS, upon arrival to the scene of Miss LaPore's supervisor took over CPR. Miss LaPore continued to assist in the lifesaving attempts until first clearing the airway and achieving a faint pulse and then further assisting until the girl had regained conciseness and began breathing on her own.

WHEREAS, in the performance of her duties as a lifeguard Marissa LePore acted in response to her many hours of training and swiftly removed the girl from the water and rendered medical care of a distinguished and unheralded nature to a person whose life was in immediate jeopardy, and did so in a manner that most certainly sustained the young girl and enabled the individual to be delivered alive to a medical facility only to be released some time later and who is expected to make a full recovery.


