

**RESOLUTION 14-112**



**WHEREAS**, the City of Spring Hill citizens have curb side recycling and is a duplicate effort of Williamson County; and


**WHEREAS**, TCA Title 68 allows the redistributing of county property tax attributable to solid waste collection and disposal within a city that is providing duplicate service; and

BOMA,

The Mayor and I met with Rogers Anderson, Bobby Cook (County Attorney), Nancy Zion (Solid Waste Director) and Nena Graham (Budget Director) this week regarding the 6 cent reduction request. They agree that the request is legal since we have started curbside recycling. In fact, Nancy's numbers shows that the program is doing quite well based on the reduction in volume at the WC Convenience Centers (except for glass, which we don't pick up and has no practical recycled value).

However, if the 6 cents is removed, the county will begin charging SH residents a fee to use the convenience centers and landfill (\$38/ton for household waste and \$115/ton for other debris). Additionally, charges will be set for SH residents for the recycling of Oil and Electronics. We were told that there are also programs in the schools currently supported by the 6 cents that would be defunded for the SH campuses and that other charges may be assessed.

The county needs to know whether or we want to have the 6 cent removed from this upcoming property tax bill. They need to know by August 29th. Therefore, we need to discuss it Monday night and vote to invoke it now or delay it a year until acceptable offsets can be worked out similarly to the arrangements with Franklin.
