

As a licensed Library Media Specialist in the State of Tennessee, I have several years of experience working in the library field. I was the Library Media Specialist at Heritage Elementary for four years. While in that position, I taught the library curriculum to the student body population and also oversaw the library and all its functions. I was responsible for the library budget, the purchase of all library materials, both print and non-print, as well as all the technology purchases for the building. I was an integral part in assessing the school budget in relation to purchases for the school as a whole and at the grade level. While at Heritage, I was also a part of the Building Leadership Team for three years which helps manage the school budget and allocates funds at the grade levels and special areas.

During the past four years, I have been involved in several volunteer positions in a variety of services. I have been the coordinator for the Harvest Roundup, a fundraiser for the Take the Reins program, based out of Thompson's Station that provides equine assisted therapy for special needs children. As coordinator, I worked with outside groups to raise funds and awareness for this program as well as coordinate and plan a large scale fundraising event.

Why do you wish to serve on the Library Board?

I wish to serve on this board because, quite simply libraries are my passion. I am a firm believer that the library is the cornerstone of the community and the foundation upon which the community finds their center for educational development and growth. Not just intellectually but creatively as well. I believe in public libraries and all they stand for. I feel that, with my experience and expertise in the field of library science and library management, I can serve the community of Spring Hill the most effectively through the Library Board.

If appointed to the Library Board, what would you like to see accomplished during your term?

My goal if appointed to the Library Board would be to facilitate the continued growth of our library program through the efficient and effective purchase of both print and non-print material as well the

continuation and expansion of other key services provided. Our children's library is one of the best in the area and I would like to see continued support and growth in this area of the library while implementing a renewed focus on the young adult and adult sections. The continuation of technological services, workshops, seminars are all paramount in the growth and success of the library. My goal is for Spring Hill library to not only be a model of service and information to our community but also as a standard that other communities look towards when building their library programs.

What do you think the Library's most important roles are for the community?

The public library has the unique role of providing its patrons with access and resources that only it can offer. The library is the information hub of a community and it is vital to the community in providing access to information, books, technology, and as a center that facilitates learning. The library must continue to be a safe place within a community that can foster not only a resource and facility for education but can provide a space for groups and individuals to meet for specific needs. The most important role of the public library is to simply be present and available for the community. I believe the success of a community has its roots in the success of its public library program.

What are some problems and challenges facing libraries?

The modern public library is at a crossroads. There is a call to find a balance between the evolution of the roles of the library within the community while still maintaining the traditions of what the public library was founded upon. This includes determining how best to utilize the funds budgeted to the library by the community. In terms of print material and its availability the library must set itself apart from bookstores and Amazon and provide the patrons with a different experience. An experience where not only are print materials available but also a number of electronic resources as well. The Spring Hill Library is already ahead of many library programs by the availability of electronic resources such as eBooks and access to the Tennessee Electronic Library among other eBook resources. Libraries must realize and embrace their changing roles in our communities to truly be the information center of a community in a diverse group of areas.
