

RESOLUTION 15-125

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DESIGN OF NINE (9) TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS ON US 31 IN THE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$228,000.00 FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen has approved a Capital Improvement program for 2015-2020, and US 31 is the highest transportation priority; and

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen realize the critical importance of investing in transportation projects along US 31 to improve safety and address congestion in a rapidly growing City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill has appropriate monies available in the Adequate Facilities Tax fund to pay for these professional services; and

WHEREAS, the following projects would be designed and prepared to a “shovel-ready” status:

- Northbound Right Turn Lane at Commonwealth Drive and US 31
- Northbound right turn lane and a Right-In/Right-Out Intersection Improvement at Nasdaq and US 31
- Northbound Right Turn Lane at Campbell Station Parkway and US 31
- Southbound Right Turn Lane at Wilkes Lane and US 31
- Right-In/Right-Out Intersection Improvement at Wilkes Lane and US 31
- Northbound right turn lane at Wilkes Court (east side of Main Street at Wilkes Lane)
- Actuated Pedestrian Crossing Improvements and retiming of Traffic Signal at Buckner Road and US 31
- Actuated Pedestrian Crossing Improvements and retiming of Traffic Signal at Campbell Station Parkway and US 31
- Actuated Pedestrian Crossing Improvements and retiming of Traffic Signal at Commonwealth Drive and US 31

WHEREAS, Dempsey Dilling and Associates is under contract as the City’s Consulting Engineer and is able to begin work on these projects immediately;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee hereby authorizes design of the nine (9) US 31 transportation projects in an amount not to exceed \$228,000.00 to be paid with monies from the Adequate Facilities Tax fund in FY 2015-2016.
