

RESOLUTION NO. 73-6

AREA V

A RESOLUTION CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING TO DETERMINE WHETHER CERTAIN TERRITORY SHOULD BE ANNEXED TO THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE.

WHEREAS, It appears that the prosperity of this town and of the territory herein described may be materially retarded and the safety and welfare of the inhabitants and property thereof endangered if such territory is not annexed; and,

WHEREAS, The annexation of such territory may be deemed necessary for the welfare of the residents and property owners of the said affected territory and this town as a whole:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee:

That the city recorder be and he hereby is instructed and required to have published in the Columbia Daily Herald of general circulation in the town on the 28th day of February, 1973, a notice that a public hearing before this body will be held at the Spring Hill Branch of the First Farmers and Merchants National Bank on the 8th day of March, 1973, to determine whether the following described territory adjoining the present corporate boundaries should be annexed:

Embracing that certain part of the Third Civil District of Maury County, Tennessee, and more fully described, to-wit:

Beginning at that point which is the most southerly in the existing city limits line (the same being the point of intersection of the southerly property line of the Tennessee Orphan Home with the westerly right-of-way line of the old Kedron Pike); thence southerly a distance of approximately 450 feet along the westerly right-of-way line of the old Kedron Pike to that point where this westerly right-of-way line intersects the center line of McCutcheon Creek; thence following the center line of McCutcheon Creek westerly a distance of approximately 25 feet to the point of intersection of the center line of McCutcheon Creek with the center line of an unnamed westerly branch of McCutcheon Creek; thence westerly with the center line of the unnamed westerly branch of McCutcheon Creek a distance of approximately 4500 feet to a point which is 300 feet east of the nearest point in the easterly right-of-way of U. S. Highway 31; thence northerly to the point of intersection with the existing city limits line (the "high water line on the north bank" of this unnamed westerly branch); thence clockwise with the existing city limits to the point of beginning and containing some 102 acres, This area would be located in the 1st. Ward of the town.
