WHEREAS, Construction of this parkway road commenced in 1937 under the supervision of the National Park Service and the Bureau of Public Roads, and as of 1973 over 100 miles of this scenic route remains to be completed, and

WHEREAS, the park facilities, historic sites, wayside exhibits, nature trails, picnic and campground areas already offer 6.5 million citizens the opportunity to commemorate the old Natchez Trace, a frontier road prominent in the development of the old Southwest.


