

RESOLUTION NO. 73-4

AREA III

A RESOLUTION CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING TO DETERMINE WHETHER CERTAIN TERRITORY SHOULD BE ANNEXED TO THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE.

WHEREAS, it appears that the prosperity of this town and of the territory herein described may be materially retarded and the safety and welfare of the inhabitants and property thereof endangered if such territory is not annexed; and,

WHEREAS, The annexation of such territory may be deemed necessary for the welfare of the residents and property owners of the said affected territory and this town as a whole:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee:

That the city recorder be and he hereby is instructed and required to have published in the Columbia Daily Herald of general circulation in the town on the 28th day of February, 1973, a notice that a public hearing before this body will be held at the Spring Hill Branch of the First Farmers and Merchants National Bank on the 8th day of March, 1973, to determine whether the following described territory adjoining the present corporate boundaries should be annexed:

Embracing that certain part of the 4th Civil District of Williamson County, Tennessee, and more fully described, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the Williamson-Maury County Line some 343 feet northwesterly of that point in the existing northerly city limits line where the center line of Wilkes Avenue (also known as the "Old Military Road" and referred to in old deeds as "the road bounding Mrs. Turner's land on the east") intersects the Williamson-Maury County Line; thence following for some 1500 feet a line parallel with and 300 feet westerly of a northerly extension of Wilkes Avenue (also known as the "Old Military Road") which extension is also the westerly property line of the S. E. Witt Farm; thence following an extension of the northerly property line of the S. E. Witt farm, 75 degrees 30 min. W some 2245 feet to its intersection with the easterly right-of-way line of the L. & N. R. R. ; thence following this right-of-way line in a southerly direction some 650 feet to the Williamson-Maury County Line, which is also the existing city limits line; thence following the Williamson-Maury County Line in a southeasterly direction some 2930 feet to the point of beginning and containing some 62 acres.

This area would be in the 3rd. Ward of the town.

All interested property owners are urged to attend this meeting.
