

A RESOLUTION CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING TO
DETERMINE WHETHER CERTAIN TERRITORY SHOULD
BE ANNEXED TO THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, it appears that the prosperity of this Town and of the territory herein described may be materially retarded and the safety and welfare of the inhabitants and property thereof endangered if such territory is not annexed; and,

WHEREAS, the annexation of such territory may be deemed necessary for the welfare of the residents and property owners of the said affected territory and this Town as a whole;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee:

That the City recorder be and she is hereby instructed and required to have published in the Herald, a newspaper of general circulation in the Town on the 11th day of January, 1980, a notice that a public hearing before this body will be held on the 21st day of January, 1980 in the Town Hall of the Town of Spring Hill to determine whether the following described territory adjoining the present corporate boundaries should be annexed:


Embracing that certain part of civil district number three (3) of Maury County and more fully described to wit; Bounded on the north by the property of Howard Hill and James Harvey; Bounded on the east by the property of Waller; Bounded on the south by the property of Fred Selle; Bounded on the west by the present city limits of Spring Hill. Beginning with a set rock, the same point of beginning being the northeast corner of the tract being described; also, the southwest corner of the James Harvey property and in the west boundary of the Waller property; Thence, with the west boundary of the Waller property south 8 degrees 06 minutes west 697 feet to the center of Duplex Road; Thence, with the center of the Duplex Road north 89 degrees 39 minutes west 1514 feet to an iron spike north 88 degrees west 922 feet to an iron spike in the center of McCutchen Creek Bridge; Thence, leaving the road and with the center of McCutchens Creek north 31 degrees 09 minutes west 105 feet north 47 degrees 59 minutes West 87 feet north 8 degrees 26 minutes east 200 feet north 26 degrees 26 minutes east 78 feet north 19 degrees 24 minutes west 87 feet; Thence, leaving the creek, north 82 degrees east 1700 feet south 85 degrees 51 minutes east 920 feet to the point of beginning; as shown on the survey map on file in the office of City Recorder.

This resolution shall be effective from and after its adoption.

Beginning with a set rock, the same point of beginning being the northeast corner of the tract being described; also, the southwest corner of the James Harvey property and in the west boundary of the Waller property; Thence with the west boundary of the Waller property south 8 degrees 06 minutes west 697 feet to the center of Duplex Road; thence, with the center of the Duplex Road north 89 degrees 39 minutes west 1514 feet to an iron spike north 88 degrees west 922 feet to an iron spike in the center of McCutchen Creek Bridge; thence, leaving the road and with the center of McCutchens Creek north 31 degrees 09 minutes west 105 feet north 47 degrees 59 minutes west 87 feet north 8 degrees 26 minutes east 200 feet north 26 degrees 26 minutes east 78 feet north 19 degrees 24 minutes west 87 feet; thence, leaving the creek, north 82 degrees east 1700 feet south 85 degrees 51 minutes east 920 feet to the point of beginning; as shown on the survey map on file in the office of City Recorder.
