A RESOLUTION TO AMEND RESOLUTION 24-229 AND RETAIN VEHICLE

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill operates a career fire department with four divisions;
and

WHEREAS; in August of 2024 following the purchase of a new vehicle, the decision was made in Resolution 24-229 to dispose of a 2013 Dodge Durango assigned to Fire Administration Division after the replacement vehicle was placed in service; and

WHEREAS; the replacement vehicle has been fully upfitted and placed in service officially on June 16, 2025; and

WHEREAS; the Fire Marshal Division gained a part-time employee in the FY26 Budget;
and


WHEREAS, in the FY26 Budget, new Fire Department support vehicles requested were removed, and the need now exists to retain the 2013 Dodge Durango for the foreseeable future in order to be used Administratively and by the Part Time Fire Inspector.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the City of Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen authorize the amendment to Resolution 24-229 authorizing the Fire Department to retain the 2013 Dodge Durango.

RE: To Amend Resolution 24-229 and Retain 2013 Dodge Durango

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this resolution is to approve an amendment to Resolution 24-229 and authorize the Fire Department to retain a 2013 Dodge Durango.

BACKGROUND:

As part of the 2024 Vehicle Replacement Schedule, the 2013 Dodge Durango was scheduled for replacement. The Durango was originally a used vehicle purchased from GovDeals in 2022 and has over 150,000 miles currently on it. The replacement vehicle for the Durango officially went into service on June 16th, and per existing Resolution 24-229 is to be listed and sold on Gov Deals.

On July 1, 2025 (FY26) the Fire Marshal's Division will gain a part-time Fire Inspector. The department does not have a vehicle for the Fire Inspector to drive, and the planned reserve vehicle(s) that they would have been able to use were removed from the FY26 Budget. Without a vehicle the Fire Inspector would be eligible to charge mileage which is not budgeted for in FY26. Additionally, it is more advantageous and safer to be in a marked vehicle on official business for the fire inspections.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Financial impact is planned to be minimum and revolve around fuel and normal planned preventative maintenance items as the transmission issues have been resolved.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 25-153.

**A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT SUV FOR
FIRE DEPARTMENT**

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Fire Department operates a career fire department that responds to all hazards within the city; and

WHEREAS; the Fire Department has planned and budgeted in FY25 for the replacement of a 2013 Dodge Durango assigned to Fire Administration; and

WHEREAS; the existing vehicle has over 150,000 miles and mechanical issues; and

WHEREAS, Wilson County Motors, the current State of Tennessee Contract Vendor for Chevrolet is taking orders for an October 2024 production run; and

WHEREAS, in order to obtain the Fire Department specified Special Service Vehicle (SSV) Chevrolet Tahoe, an order must be placed in advance of the production run to guarantee delivery by the end of December 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the City of Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen authorize the purchase of one (1) Chevrolet Tahoe SSV from Wilson County Motors under State of Tennessee Vehicle Contract SW209 at a price of \$52,406.20 and to permit the sale of the existing 2013 Dodge Durango on GOVDEALS.

RE: Purchase of Replacement SUV

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this resolution is to allow the Fire Department to purchase (1) Chevrolet Tahoe Special Service Vehicle (SSV) as replacement vehicle to be assigned to Fire Administration.

BACKGROUND:

The department has an apparatus and vehicle replacement schedule that was established in 2022 and has budgeted for the replacement in FY25 of a 2013 Dodge Durango that was purchased used from GovDeals. The Durango has over 150,000 miles and recurrent intermittent transmission issues. The replacement vehicle will be assigned to Fire Administration and will be used to conduct Community Risk Reduction visits, pull the public education trailer, and to respond to major incidents.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The funding for the purchase of the vehicles has been budgeted in FY25 CEP and will be made through Wilson County Motors using State of Tennessee Vehicle Contract SWC209.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 24-227 to purchase one (1) Chevrolet Tahoe Special Service Vehicle (SSV) from Wilson County Motors in the amount of \$52,406.20 and to place the 2013 Dodge Durango on GovDeals for sale as is.
