

ORDINANCE NO. 73-4

AREA IV

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY AND TO INCORPORATE SAME WITHIN THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE.

WHEREAS, a public hearing before this body was held on the 8th. day of March, 1973, pursuant to Resolution No. 73-2 adopted on February 26, 1973, and notice thereof published in the Columbia Daily Herald on February 28, 1973; and,

WHEREAS, it now appears that the prosperity of this town and of the territory herein described will be materially retarded and the safety and welfare of the inhabitants and property thereof endangered if such territory is not annexed; and,

WHEREAS, the annexation of such territory is deemed necessary for the welfare of the residents and property owners thereof and of this town as a whole; and,

WHEREAS, a plan of service for this area was adopted by Resolution No. 73-1 on February 26, 1973, as required by section 6-309, Tennessee Code Annotated;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee:

Section 1. Pursuant to authority conferred by sections 6-308 to 6-320, Tennessee Code Annotated, there is hereby annexed to the Town of Spring Hill, Tennessee, and incorporated within the corporate boundaries thereof, the following described territory adjoining the present corporate boundaries:

Embracing that certain part of the Third Civil District of Maury County, Tennessee, and more fully described, to-wit:

Beginning at that point where the center line of an unnamed westerly branch of McCutcheon Creek intersects a line which is 300 feet east of the nearest point in the easterly right-of-way line of U. S. Highway 31; thence following the center line of this unnamed branch of McCutcheon Creek in a northwesterly direction some 5600 feet to its intersection with the easterly right-of-way line of the L. & N. R. R.; thence following this easterly right-of-way line in a northeasterly direction some 3200 feet to its intersection with the existing city limits line; thence following the existing city limits in a clock-wise direction to that point where the northeasterly high water mark of the westerly unnamed branch of McCutcheon Creek crosses a line parallel with and 300 feet east of the nearest point in the easterly right-of-way line of U. S. Highway 31; thence following this easterly right-of-way line in a southerly direction to the center of the unnamed branch of McCutcheon Creek, the point of beginning, and containing some 305 acres. This area would be located in the 4th. Ward of the town.

ORDINANCE NO. 73-4 (cont.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective from and after its final passage, the public welfare requiring it.
