

RESOLUTION 17-61

A RESOLUTION TO CONFIRM THE SELECTION OF ARCHITECTS DESIGN GROUP (ADG), PARTNERED WITH HFR DESIGN AS THE ARCHITECTURAL FIRM TO DESIGN AND SUPERVISE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW POLICE HEADQUARTERS FOR THE CITY OF SPRING HILL, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen approved Resolution 14-47, authorizing an assessment of the need for expanded facilities for the City's police headquarters, and

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen, in recognition of this need, authorized city staff to develop a RFQ document, appoint a selection committee to determine a preferred architectural firm to design and supervise the construction of a of the City's police headquarters, and

WHEREAS, the selection committee has considered the qualifications of all architectural firms responding to the RFQ for the new police headquarters, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Spring Hill hereby authorizes the selection Architect Design Group (ADG), partnered with HFR Design, to be the selected architectural firm to design and manage the construction of the new police headquarters for the City of Spring Hill.

The selection committee for the Police Headquarters architectural services is recommending Architects Design Group (ADG), partnered with HFR Design as the firm to design a new Police Headquarters Facility.

The committee, Chief Don Brite and Deputy Chief Jason Fogle, Fire Chief Terry Hood, City Engineer Tom Wolf, Alderman's Matt Fitterer and Amy Wurth, met with the selected firms, who were invited to make a presentation to the committee on Monday, May 8th.

The four firms, Askew and Bauer, Kennon/Calhoun Workshop, TMPartners, and Architects Design Group were selected from the advertised RFQ bids that the City of Spring Hill received from interested firms. There were a total of seven bids received.

After the presentation made by each of the above mentioned firms, the committee met and reviewed each firms presentation. All four firms made very good presentations based on their experience and knowledge and addressed the scope of the police department's project.

The committee chose Architects Design Group based on the firms experience and specializing in the design of law enforcement facilities, along with partnering with a local architectural firm. Their track record in working with government entities and knowledge of the political process, along with their expertise in public safety distanced themselves from the other firms. The firms in-house experience across the board allows for them to keep the phases of the project "in-house".

Based on the above, the committee respectfully recommends Architects Design Group for this project.
