
**WHEREAS**, the Spring Hill Fire Department is in need of replacing the current rescue tools on Rescue 62; and

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**PURPOSE:**

Replacing older extrication equipment with newer electro-hydraulic rescue tools. Furthermore Maury County Fire, Williamson County Rescue, Columbia Fire, Franklin Fire all used this same extrication equipment. In the event of a large scale incident all the above agency's equipment can be integrated together during the emergency.

**BACKGROUND:**

Rescue 2 responds to every MVA in the City of Spring Hill, runs mutual aid with surrounding departments with the purchase of these extrication rescue tools it would allow for better inoperability. Furthermore vehicle technology has change over the years with stronger metals being used in the production of motor vehicles.
