

**RESOLUTION 18-99**

**A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENT OF THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SPRING HILL TO INITIATE DISCUSSIONS LEADING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CONTRACT WITH THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION RELATED TO THE FUNDING OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES AND PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING FOR THE EXPANSION OF HIGHWAY 31 (S.R.6)**


**WHEREAS**, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen has consistently named an expanded U.S. Highway 31 (S.R.6) as a top priority related to local transportation infrastructure needs; and

**WHEREAS**, Tennessee Department of Transportation has included U.S. Highway 31 (S.R.6) within the "Improve Act" adopted by the State Legislature in 2017; and


**WHEREAS**, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen have expressed a desire to have U.S. Highway 31 (S.R.6) be a priority within the \$6 billion dollars-worth of infrastructure needs identified in the Improve Act and will consider funding of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and preliminary engineering (PE) studies associated with the expansion of said route.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen authorizes the Mayor and City Administrator to develop a contract with TDOT, in a form to be adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen at a later date, for the purpose of providing funding for the NEPA and PE studies establishing costs and timelines for completion of work.
