I. Purpose/Overview: To dispose of vehicles awarded to the Spring Hill PD by the State of Tennessee.

II. Background Information: The vehicles were seized during traffic stops due to an arrest made for either a DUI or drug offense. State law allows for seizures on certain offenses of these arrest. The vehicles have been in our possession for several years and cases related to the vehicles have been disposed of through the court system. The Appeals Division of the Tn Department of Safety awarded the vehicles to our department. All avenues of appeals have expired; thus, the final judgement of the court awarded the department the vehicles. The Final Order of Forfeiture for each vehicle is attached. The vehicles, due to their condition, due not benefit the police department. Sometimes, seized vehicles can be utilized by the department, if they are functional. The first two vehicles are the DUI seizures, because of this, by state law, when the department sells it, the proceeds go back to the State for alcohol treatment programs. We can keep storage fees we accumulated. The last two vehicles are drug related, therefore, the proceeds go to the departments drug fund.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act (T.C.A. §4-5-101, *et seq.*), and Rules of Procedure for Asset Forfeiture Proceedings (Rule 1340-2-2-.01, *et seq.*), this Final Order may be reviewed as follows:

1) **Petition for Stay:** Within seven (7) days of the **Entry Date** of this Final Order, any party may file a Petition for Stay of this Order with the **APPEALS DIVISION**. In any such Petition for Stay, the petitioner must certify that a copy of the Petition for Stay has been sent to the Legal Division of the Department of Safety. Any such petition must be received by the Appeals Division within this seven (7) day period. **Date of postmark will not be accepted.** A Petition for Stay of this Order does not extend the sixty (60) day period.

2) **Petition for Reconsideration:** Within fifteen (15) days of the **Entry Date** of this Final Order, any party may file a Petition for Reconsideration of this Final Order with the **APPEALS DIVISION**. Any such petition must be received by the Appeals Division within this fifteen (15) day period. **Date of postmark will not be accepted.** A Petition for Reconsideration of this Order does not extend the sixty (60) day period. If the Petition for Reconsideration is granted, the sixty (60) day period is tolled and a new sixty (60) day period commences on the Effective Date of the Final Order disposing of the Petition for Reconsideration. A Petition for Reconsideration is deemed denied if no action is taken within twenty (20) days of filing.

3) **Judicial Review:** Within sixty (60) days of the **Entry Date** of this Final Order, any party may seek judicial review of this Order by filing a **Petition for Review** in the **Chancery Court of Davidson County, Tennessee**. Securing judicial review of this Order will require a legal brief, and your lawsuit must meet certain time guidelines after it is filed. If you plan to file a lawsuit, you are advised to obtain the services of a licensed attorney. The following telephone number and office may be helpful to you: Chancery Court Clerk, (615) 862-5710, in the Metro Courthouse in Nashville, TN. The clerk is prohibited from giving legal advice.

**Parties who seek review of this Order must be familiar with the provisions of the foregoing statute and administrative rules.** Failure to comply with the provisions of either will result in a denial of a review.
