A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE DISPOSAL AND SALE OF MOTOROLA PORTABLE RADIOS

WHEREAS, Spring Hill Police Department purchased 60 Motorola APX 6000 portable used radios for \$150,000.00, to be used with the Williamson County radio system; and

WHEREAS, the purchased Motorola radios do not have built in Wi-Fi capability and cannot be programmed and rekeyed over the air; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Radio Authority Board determined that the radios do not meet their required specifications; and

WHEREAS, Spring Hill Police Department requests that the radios and hardware be sold to a third-party vendor and/or be advertised to be sold on Gov Deals.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Spring Hill authorizes the disposal and sale of 60 Motorola APX 6000 portable radios to a third party and/or advertise to sale on Gov Deals, as recommended by the Budget and Finance Advisory Committee on March 4, 2019.

Passed and adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee on the 18th day of March, 2019.





Radio Disposal

- I. Purpose/Overview:** To sale or advertise to sale on Gov Deals, 60 Motorola APX 6000 portable radios.

- II. Background Information:** Our current radio system and hardware, UHF band, is outdated and in need of repair and or installation of new equipment. Williamson County, Franklin and Brentwood consolidated to acquire a new interoperable radio system to allow for better communication. Spring Hill Police Department requested to join the consolidation by purchasing mobile and portable radios. The Motorola radio system consist of the APX 6000 portable (hand held) radios. To save costs, SHPD purchased 60 previously owned portable radios from Armor Corps. The radios were inspected and deemed to meet the specs for the Williamson County system. Unfortunately, this radio model, AN, does not have built in WI-FI capability, and cannot be programmed and rekeyed over the air. This could be performed manually. The Williamson radio authority board determined that these radios will not be allowed to be used because the radios cannot be updated over the air.

- III. Financial Impact to Budget:** to recoup the cost of the radios at \$150,000.00.

- V. Staff Recommendations:** Recommend to BOMA to sale the radios to a third-party vendor or advertise to be sold on Gov Deals.
