

**RESOLUTION 19-45**

**A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE AN EXTENSION OF THE WASTE MANAGEMENT CONTRACT FOR SANITATION SERVICES**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen recognizes sanitation services are essential and needed to serve the residents and businesses of the City of Spring Hill; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution 12-75 was passed by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen on October 15, 2012, to contract with Waste Management for sanitation services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill approved Resolution 15-94 on August 17, 2015 providing for a Contract extension to the initial contract with an amended effective period of the contract scheduled to expire on March 31, 2019; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Spring Hill wishes to extend the existing contract for one additional month at current rates to allow time for staff to negotiate a new contract with Waste Management.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill approves the extension of the existing contract to expire on April 30, 2019.
