A RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT AN ICAC SUB-GRANT FROM THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Spring Hill Police is a member of the Tennessee Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC) and utilizes the training and equipment provided to conduct ICAC investigations; and


WHEREAS, Pursuant to grant agreement No. 49530, the Metropolitan Nashville Government has agreed to distribute a portion of grant funds to surrounding Middle Tennessee Internet Crimes Against Children ("ICAC") agencies for equipment, training, and travel related to ICAC investigations; and,

WHEREAS, the Police Department has been awarded a \$15,000.00 grant from Metro Nashville Government with funding to be allocated towards equipment, training and travel solely for I.C.A.C investigations conducted by Spring Hill Police Department; and

WHEREAS, no matching funds are required to receive this funding.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Spring Hill accepts the ICAC grant of \$15,000.00 to be used by the Police Department towards training, equipment and travel for ICAC investigations.

- I. Purpose/Overview: To approve sub-grant funding from Metro Nashville Government to the police department for ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children).

- II. Background Information: Spring Hill Police Department currently has a Detective, Mike Foster, who is assigned to the ICAC task force. This is a statewide taskforce having limited agencies across the state. Detective Foster investigates Internet Crimes Against Children, not only for our jurisdiction but for other agencies needing his assistance. Metro Nashville police department receives funding from Knoxville Police Department, who oversees the entire ICAC funding. Metro Police Department then allocates funds to Middle Tennessee agencies who are with the ICAC taskforce.

We are receiving \$15,000.00 to be used solely for equipment, training, and travel to be used for ICAC investigations.

- III. Financial Impact to Budget. No matching funds required.

- IV. Alternative Options: don't accept the grant funding.

- V. Staff Recommendations: Highly recommend accepting the grant funding, due to the benefits gained when Detective Foster investigates these types of criminal activities that take place in and around our community.
