A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF SPRING HILL AND MAURY COUNTY FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT REGARDING THE DONATION OF PORTABLE RADIOS

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill Police Department desires to donate 106 Kenwood UHF portable and mobile radios not currently in use in inventory with an estimated value of \$10,600.00 to the Maury County Fire and Rescue Department; and


WHEREAS, in exchange, the Maury County Fire and Rescue Department will provide, through its own efforts or that of a third party, site development services for the police firearms training property located on Williamsport Pike (to include the installation of drainage pipes, levelling of the land and development of a gravel parking lot) for an estimated value of \$7,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the Maury County Fire and Rescue Department will also provide site development services on land acquired in the future by the City, at a location to be determined, for the purpose of a police training facility equivalent to the remaining amount of the difference between the value of the donated radios and the service already provided (\$3,100.00); and

WHEREAS, it is mutually financially beneficial for the City and the Maury County Fire and Rescue Department to work together to meet their stated needs.





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE CITY OF SPRING HILL AND MAURY COUNTY FIRE AND RESCUE
DEPARTMENT REGARDING THE DONATION OF PORTABLE RADIOS

This Memorandum of Understanding is executed by and between the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee ("City") and Maury County Fire and Rescue Department.

WHEREAS, the City of Spring Hill Police Department desires to donate 106 Kenwood UHF portable and mobile radios not currently in use in inventory with an estimated value of \$10,600.00 to the Maury County Fire and Rescue Department; and

WHEREAS, in exchange, Maury County Fire and Rescue Department will provide, through its own efforts or that of a third party, site development services for the police firearms training property located on Williamsport Pike (to include the installation of drainage pipes, levelling of the land and development of a gravel parking lot) for an estimated value of \$7,500.00; and


WHEREAS, Maury County Fire and Rescue Department will also provide site development services on land acquired in the future by the City, at a location to be determined, for the purpose of a police training facility equivalent to the remaining amount of the difference between the value of the donated radios and the service already provided (\$3,100.00); and

WHEREAS, it is mutually financially beneficial for the City and Maury County Fire and Rescue Department to work together to meet their stated needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED between City and Maury County Fire and Rescue Department as follows:

1. The City of Spring Hill will donate 106 Kenwood UHF portable and mobile radios at an estimated valuation of \$10,600.00 to Maury County Fire and Rescue Department in exchange for site development services provided or caused to be provided by Maury County Fire and Rescue Department at the police firearms training property located on Williamsport Pike upon completion of said site development services at an estimated value of \$7,500.00.
2. The Maury County Fire and Rescue Department to provide additional site development services valued at an estimated \$3,100.00 to be performed on a future City police training facility, the location of which to be determined in exchange for donation of Kenwood UHF portable and mobile radios.
3. Any modification to this Memorandum of Understanding shall be in writing and shall be signed by both parties hereto.
