TENNESSEE CARES GRANT**


**WHEREAS**, the Spring Hill Board of Mayor and Aldermen wish to provide for the citizens the highest quality of library services as may be possible; and

**WHEREAS**, the Spring Hill Public Library has been identified for a State of Tennessee CARES Grant that shall enhance the services provided to the Library's patrons; and



Ms. Juriew,

Congratulations on receiving a CARES Grant. We received over \$836,000 in requests and have \$419,726 in funding available, so many applicants will not receive the full amount they requested. The award decisions were not made lightly, and while we wish we could fund everyone fully, the budget will not allow for it. In order for you to better understand how the calculations were created, the steps are listed below.

1. Hotspots
  - a. Limit of 5 per application
  - b. Reduced to 10 months of funding
2. Chromebooks
  - a. Limit of 4 per application
  - b. Maximum cost of each Chromebook limited to \$250
3. Videoconferencing
  - a. Television maximum cost set at \$700
  - b. Television cart maximum cost set at \$300
  - c. Laptop maximum cost set at \$750
    - i. Any specialized laptops for editing purposes reduced to \$750
  - d. Uninterruptable Power Supplies (UPS) deleted
  - e. All editing software deleted, as not necessary for videoconferencing
  - f. Videoconferencing subscriptions limited to 1 subscription per application
    - i. GoTo Meeting maximum cost set at \$144
    - ii. WebEx maximum cost set at \$162
    - iii. Zoom maximum cost set at \$65
      1. Subscription available through TechSoup
  - g. Webcam maximum cost set at \$200
4. All request rounded down to a whole number.

Based on the above calculations, your library will receive the following as a grant award:

The grant started on April 21, 2020 and end on May 31, 2021. You will receive a contract via email for signature. While you may begin spending once you have received this award notification, we will be unable to reimburse you until we have a fully signed contract in place.

**Please note** Secretary Hargett will be contacting your legislators regarding your grant award. Considering this, please do not advertise to the media that you have received your grant at this time.
