Passed and adopted by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee on the 16th day of August, 2021.



RE: To authorize the sale of surplus vehicles for the Fire Department

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this resolution is to authorize the sale of two surplus vehicles through GovDeals online auction for the Fire Department.

BACKGROUND:

The City's Fire Department desires to sell two surplus vehicles through GovDeals online auction:

- ~~2002 Freightliner FL8 – VIN 1FVABXBS02DK04173 – A new fire engine has been purchased for replacement. The recommended life of a fire engine is not to exceed 15 years and the surplus truck is in need of costly maintenance.~~ *Removed for donation*
- 2000 Nissan Frontier – VIN 1N6ED27T1YC309263 – This vehicle requires extensive maintenance and has high mileage.

~~If the 2002 Freightliner does not sell for the minimum bid (\$5,000), City staff will present a subsequent request that it be donated to a surrounding county (either Maury County or Lincoln County) for their use as they currently have the need for one.~~
