

ORDINANCE NO. 22-05

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 8, CHAPTER 1, INTOXICATING LIQUORS,
OF THE CITY OF SPRING HILL CODE OF ORDINANCES**

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen are given the opportunity under TCA 57-3-204 to regulated the number and location of off-premise sales for intoxicating liquor ; and

WHEREAS, Title 8, Chapter 1, Section 107 states the “No more than one license may be issued for each 5,000 in population that has been determined by a certified censuses count.”; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee believe that an adequate number of licenses exist for the current population based on the current availability of commercial space;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Spring Hill, Tennessee, that:

Section 1. Title 8, Chapter 1, Intoxicating Liquors, Section 107 be amended to read: “No more than one license may be issued for each **8,000** in population that has been determined by a certified censuses count.” and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FUTHER ORDAINED, that all ordinances or partial ordinances in conflict herewith be, and the same hereby are, repealed or modified as the case may be.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen.



STAFF MEMORANDUM

RE: Amendments to the Title 8, Chapter 1

The amendment attached will change the per capita calculation on the limit of the number of stores from 1 store per 5,000 residents to 1 store per 8,000 residents. We currently have six stores, fairly evenly spread between north and south of the city. There has been some discussion of waiting to permit more stores until some of the newer commercial centers are available.

This ordinance change will do that. At 50,005 population, we could approve 4 more licenses for a total of 10 stores. At 1 per 8,000, the current number of 6 stores would be the limit. Future Boards could change this back at any time should city decide to permit more stores.
