
WHEREAS, the following vehicles are recommended to be sold at auction (Gov Deals); and

FINAL ORDER OF DEFAULT AND DISMISSAL

This matter was heard via WebEx on August 17, 2021, before Richard M. Murrell, Administrative Judge, assigned by the Secretary of State, and sitting for the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security. Ms. Karen Litwin, Staff Attorney for the Department of Safety and Homeland Security (Department), represented the seizing agencies. Claimant was not present nor was an attorney present on Claimant's behalf.

The subject of this hearing was the proposed forfeiture of the subject vehicle. The matter was heard upon the State's Motion to be granted a Final Default Order due to the Claimant's failure to appear at the hearing after receiving proper notice thereof.

After consideration of the record, it is determined that the State's Motion is proper and should be **GRANTED**. It is further **ORDERED** that the vehicle should be **FORFEITED** to the

seizing agency. This decision is based upon the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The subject vehicle was seized from Jeremy Runions by the Spring Hill Police Dept. on August 28, 2020.
2. Mr. Runions claimed an interest in the vehicle but did not appear at the hearing on August 17, 2021. Mr. King did appear at the setting on May 18, 2021 and requested a continuance in order to retain counsel.
3. The matter was continued from May 18, 2021 by joint motion to permit Mr. Runions the additional time. The matter was reset to August 17, 2021. At that time, Attorney Karen Litwin indicated that Mr. King had been mailed instructions to sign into the WebEx hearing on August 6, 2021
4. On August 17, 2021, Mr. Runions failed to appear, and the State made its motion for default.
5. The State was prepared to proceed with the hearing and the State's witness was present.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Department of Safety Rule 1340-2-2-.17(1) provides in part:
 - (e) Upon default by a party, an administrative judge may enter either an Initial Default Order or an Order for an uncontested proceeding...
2. The State having established that the Claimant's attorney received notice of the hearing and failed to appear, it is determined that the State has complied with the requirements of the above referenced Rule.

3. Accordingly, it is determined that the State's motion should be **GRANTED** and the Claimant be held in **DEFAULT**. It is further **ORDERED** that the subject vehicle be **FORFEITED** to the seizing agency.

It is so **ORDERED**.

NOTICE OF APPEAL PROCEDURES

REVIEW OF FINAL ORDER

The Administrative Judge's decision in your case with the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security, called a Final Order, was entered on August 24, 2021. If you disagree with this decision, you may take the following actions.

1. **File a Petition for Reconsideration:** You may ask the Administrative Judge to reconsider the decision by filing a Petition for Reconsideration with the Administrative Procedures Division (APD). A Petition for Reconsideration should include your name and the above APD case number and should state the specific reasons why you think the decision is incorrect. APD must receive your written Petition no later than 15 days after entry of the Final Order, which is no later than **September 8, 2021**. Filing instructions are included at the end of this document.

The Administrative Judge has 20 days from receipt of your Petition to grant, deny, or take no action on your Petition for Reconsideration. If the Petition is granted, you will be notified about further proceedings, and the timeline for appealing (as discussed in paragraph (2), below) will be adjusted. If no action is taken within 20 days, the Petition is deemed denied. As discussed below, if the Petition is denied, you may file an appeal no later than **October 25, 2021**. See TENN. CODE ANN. §§ 4-5-317 and 4-5-322.

2. **File an Appeal:** You may appeal the decision by filing a Notice of Review of the Final Order in the Circuit Court or Chancery Court of "Davidson, Washington, Knox, Hamilton, Putnam, Madison, Dyer, Lawrence, or Shelby County; provided, that, the Notice of Review shall be filed in the county which corresponds with the location of the hearing," within 60 days of the date of entry of the Final Order, which is no later than **October 25, 2021**. See TENN. CODE ANN. §§ 4-5-322 & 40-33-213. The filing of a Petition for Reconsideration is not required before appealing. See TENN. CODE ANN. § 4-5-317.

STAY

In addition to the above actions, you may file a Petition asking the Administrative Judge for a stay that will delay the effectiveness of the Final Order. A Petition for Stay must be received by APD within 7 days of the date of entry of the Final Order, which is no later than **August 31, 2021**. See TENN. CODE ANN. § 4-5-316. A reviewing court also may order a stay of the Order upon appropriate terms. See TENN. CODE ANN. §§ 4-5-322 and 4-5-317.

It is hereby ORDERED:



- 2. Agrees to pay any Settlement amounts and/or take possession of the seized property before the expiration of the time period set forth in the ORDER OF COMPROMISE AND SETTLEMENT issued by the assigned Administrative Judge with the Secretary of State Administrative Procedures Division;
- 3. Agrees that failure to meet the terms of this SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT will result in a request for a Show Cause hearing which may result in forfeiture of CLAIMANT'S interest;
- 4. Voluntarily waives his/her constitutional right to be free from excessive fines or cruel and unusual punishment under the federal and state constitutions as it may apply to any future criminal prosecution for those acts giving rise to this forfeiture action, or to this forfeiture proceeding;
- 5. Waives any legal claim or cause of action which he/she might otherwise have as a result of any acts underlying this forfeiture proceeding;
- 6. Releases the SPRING HILL POLICE DEPT, the State of Tennessee, the Department of Safety and Homeland Security, and all their agents, officers, employees, servants, successors, assigns, executors, heirs, and administrators from all claims for injuries or damages, whether now known or what may accrue in the future, arising out of this seizure; and
- 7. Acknowledges that no promise, inducement or agreement not contained herein has been made to him/her, and that this SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT contains the entire terms of the agreement between the parties, which terms are contractual and not a mere recital.

The parties have carefully read this SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, know and understand its contents and sign as their own free act and deed.

This SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT is not intended and should not be construed as an admission of liability of the State, the seizing agency, or its employees, or as a waiver of the State's sovereign immunity or the employee's official immunity.

It being the intent of the parties to fully settle all claims under Tennessee's civil forfeiture law arising in connection with the above seizure, this CIVIL SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT is entered into by and between CLAIMANT(S) and the STATE OF TENNESSEE through the COMMISSIONER OF THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY, or its agents. I certify by signature on this document that CLAIMANT/CLAIMANT'S ATTORNEY acknowledges that the above has been explained to CLAIMANT, and that CLAIMANT is in agreement with the above Settlement, and that said Settlement shall constitute the final disposition of the above-described property.

Releases the SPRING HILL POLICE DEPT, the State of Tennessee, the Department of Safety and Homeland Security, and all their agents, officers, employees, servants, successors, assigns, executors, heirs, and administrators from all claims for injuries or damages, whether now known or what may accrue in the future, arising out of this seizure; and
- 7. Acknowledges that no promise, inducement or agreement not contained herein has been made to him/her, and that this SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT contains the entire terms of the agreement between the parties, which terms are contractual and not a mere recital.

The parties have carefully read this SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, know and understand its contents and sign as their own free act and deed.

This SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT is not intended and should not be construed as an admission of liability of the State, the seizing agency, or its employees, or as a waiver of the State's sovereign immunity or the employee's official immunity.

It being the intent of the parties to fully settle all claims under Tennessee's civil forfeiture law arising in connection with the above seizure, this CIVIL SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT is entered into by and between CLAIMANT(S) and the STATE OF TENNESSEE through the COMMISSIONER OF THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY, or its agents. I certify by signature on this document that CLAIMANT/CLAIMANT'S ATTORNEY acknowledges that the above has been explained to CLAIMANT, and that CLAIMANT is in agreement with the above Settlement, and that said Settlement shall constitute the final disposition of the above-described property.
