

**RESOLUTION 22-221**

**A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE AND MODIFIED TRAFFIC PATTERN ON BUCKNER LANE FOR CONSTRUCTION, TIE-IN, AND REALIGNMENT OF BUCKNER LANE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Spring Hill has approved construction plans for the realignment of Buckner Lane in association with the Master Development of June Lake; and

**WHEREAS**, Don Alexander of Southeast Venture contacted City Staff requesting a partial lane closure of Buckner Lane utilizing a modified traffic pattern and flagmen to ensure safety of automobile traffic and in order to make necessary public road improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed lane closure will occur in multiple phases to facilitate realignment of Buckner Lane and necessary tie-ins to Buckner Lane, Westchester and Thompson Station Road; and

**WHEREAS**, Southeast Venture has provided a traffic control plan detailing the intended traffic management measure implemented at each tie-in to ensure safe traffic conditions.

**WHEREAS**, Southeast Venture must provide a specified date range and time of day for the proposed lane closure and alternative traffic pattern for each phase of construction to the City Engineering and Director of Public Works prior to start of construction; and

**WHEREAS**, Southeast Venture must provide an updated traffic control and erosion plan submitted for approval by the City Engineer and prior to the beginning of construction; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Mayor and Alderman of the City of Spring Hill:

1. Authorizes the proposed partial lane closure of Buckner Lane as illustrated on the attached preliminary full road closure plan to allow for the realignment and necessary tie-ins to Buckner Lane to begin within thirty (30) days following approval of an updated traffic control and erosion plan by the City Engineer and provisions of providing specified date and times of the lane closures so that the general public can be notified accordingly.
2. Southeast Ventures Shall provide an updated control plan that includes the placement of a message board to alert the general public of future lane closure and alternative traffic pattern.


